# 2017 Annual Report



ow do you estimate the value of a pair of shoes for a single mother living out of her car who walked up to our doors barefoot? How do you evaluate the effectiveness of thousands of "Could I pray for you about that?" conversations? How do you add up the difference three bags of groceries every week makes for a family over a year? How do you measure the impact that 855 hours of one-on-one reading makes for children in our town? In a tangible sense, it is immeasurable, but in an eternal sense it is service precious to God.

It has been 10 years since The Canby Center first opened its doors to serve the community! In the early days our events, like Canby Cares at Wait Park, served hundreds of people with medical, dental, vision, food, and clothing assistance. Since then, The Canby Center has sought to bring immediate assistance to over 2,000 people year-round, through programs focused on relationships, which strengthen dignity and inspire learning.

In some of the first meetings about The Canby Center, our founders dreamed of having a center for youth and families in the community where God's love was freely shared. Ten years later we are in a 5,400 sq ft building of our own, with a mortgage that we are paying down faithfully each month. Our doors are open to everyone the Lord brings us. In 2017, we shared the love of Christ through 10,428 service touchpoints.

#### A few highlights this year:

- Reading Mentors program grew from about 50 students to about 120 students, under the capable and wise leadership of the Reading Mentors Program Coordinator, Kathleen Hanberg.
- Food more than doubled in 2017 (118,498 lbs) over 2016 (51,284)! The bulk of the food shared is healthy fresh vegetables, meats, bread, dairy and it is free.
- **84,164 lbs of clothing** went out to area families. Our clothing volunteers shared more clothing with the community in 2017 than in any year
- 9,407 Backpack Buddies food packs were distributed to children throughout the school district. This is almost 1,000 more packs than the year prior (8,559 in 2016).
- We began our Kitchen Renewal project in December. Many people have given time, expertise, and finances to ensure people in Canby have access to healthy food and a way to learn healthy cooking skills. The project is anticipated to be complete in April 2018.
- Canby Ministry Collective was hosted by The Canby Center every other month for the last year to convene local senior ministry leaders to pray for and better engage our community.

- 2. Building financial capacity for expansion of programs
- 3. Expanding the Reading Mentors program district wide
- 4. Launching a new mentoring program for families and academically challenged youth
- 5. Designing a facility master plan and conducting a corresponding capital campaign

Each of these priorities will require a great deal of energy, time, expertise, and capital to complete. Our goal is to develop relationships, programming, and facilities where in God's love we renew dignity and inspire learning for youth and families. This is no small task, but if successful by God's measure, perhaps other communities beyond our own could benefit from our shared effort.
